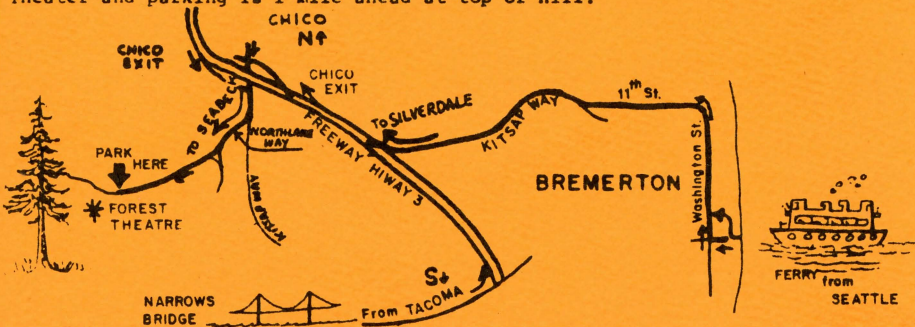

Forest Theatre is 8 miles west of Bremerton on Seabeck Road. Use Chico exits from Bremerton Freeway, then go South, turning right onto Northlake Way (.7 miles from Freeway exit), then right again at .4 miles onto Seabeck Road. Theater and parking is 1 mile ahead at top of hill.
