There are many more things that appear in Kansas and Oz, see how many you can find. At the end of the show let a cast member know how many you found. On the way home with your family, see who was the best detective. Remember to think creatively and look for more than objects, look for actions that show up in both worlds, too!

A final note, not only does 2003 mark the 80th anniversary of the Mountaineer Players, it also marks 100 years since the first stage version of *The Wizard of Oz* was performed. ~ Craig Schieber
