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Notes from Broadway Director Susan Shulman

In 1998, as this show was being revived on Broadway, Director Susan Shulman was interviewed by R&H Theatricals. Here are some of her thoughts:

“The stage version of *The Sound of Music* is actually far grittier than the movie. There's real drama . . . and also a grand romance, set in very troubled, very difficult times – which is the best way to have a romance.

You have this beautiful world – this magnificent place – God's magnificent creation, and it's teetering on the edge of destruction. What an unbelievable metaphor, and the authors knew how to use it, how to keep their characters in the shadows of those huge mountains, those incredible Alps. They are at one moment the most beautiful things you have ever seen, and then the next moment forbidding.

The Sound of Music has pure heart. It's about people who walk in a complicated world, but walk in an uncomplicated way. They love God, each other, and their country. And when this love is challenged, they meet that challenge with courage and sacrifice. It's a great story to reveal . . . playing to issues that are still current, and themes that are totally and completely timeless. It's a show that has never been out of our lives, and yet works today as fresh and new as when it was written.”
