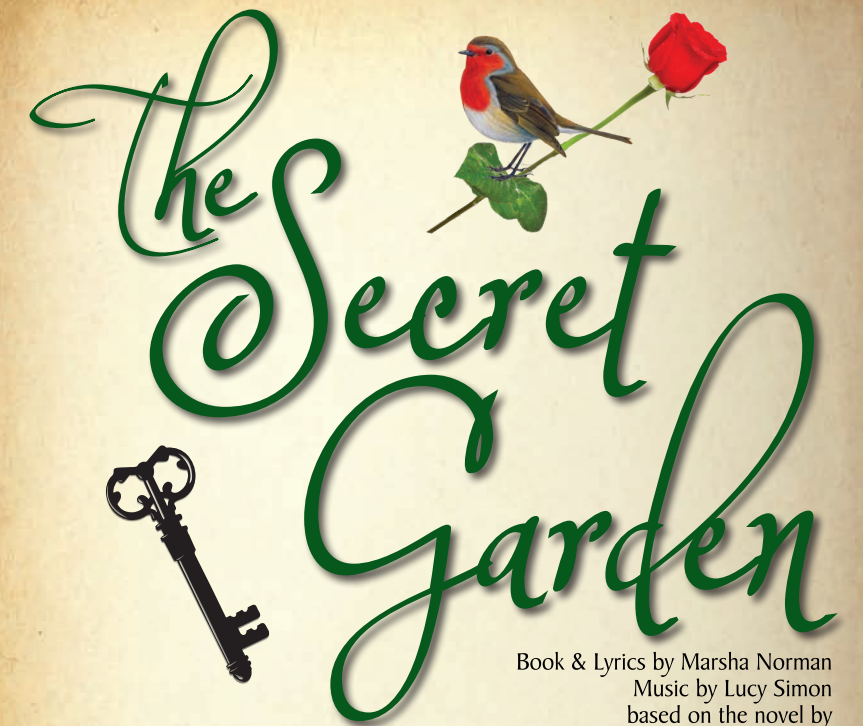

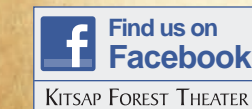

Director's Notes

This Broadway musical version of *The Secret Garden* tells much of the untold story of the adults in Mary Lennox's life (the main character in the first part of *The Secret Garden* book). In telling the story, Marsha Norman, the playwright, has used several poetic story telling techniques that wander into an ethereal world that we all may experience but use different language or belief systems to explain. Marsha Norman has chosen "dreamers" to represent these thoughts and voices that populate our minds.

The main characters in the story (Mary, Colin, Archibald, and Dr. Craven) are all struggling with personal challenges coming from traumatic life experiences. These psychic challenges, creating multiple voices in their minds, are shown by the "dreamers" on stage that at one time represent memories from the past and other times are ghosts (feelings) of the present. These dreamers are all people who are dead but who live on in the four lead character's minds. Until each of these four lead characters can come to some resolution to the internal conflicts they are experiencing, these "ghosts" cannot go on to be quiet memories of days gone by.

Though the underlying plot told here is complex, the beautiful, memorable music and a story of overcoming great challenges by the children, Mary and Colin, can be enjoyed by all ages. The values of forgiveness and acceptance are lessons we learn throughout our lives.

Charlie Vail Memorial "Big Tree" Trail
